AMENDING Public Health COVID-19 Safer-At-Home Order (vApril-23-2020)

- Purpose, Effective Area.** The April 23, 2020 Lake County Public Health Order is being amended to include updated guidance issued by Colorado Governor Jared Polis on May 25, 2020, specifically concerning changes in limitations and allowances for operations of Retail Food Establishments (“Restaurants”) and Lodging Establishments. This and related preceding Public Health Orders are in place to limit the health impacts of COVID-19. This Order is effective within the entirety of Lake County, including the City of Leadville.
- Effective Date and Time, Limitations.** On April 23, 2020, Lake County Public Health Agency (LCPHA) issued a Public Health Order to set forth requirements for general public conduct; group gatherings and events; business operations, including retail, restaurant, and personal services; short-term lodging; and provide additional guidance to slow the spread of the COVID-19 virus, and became effective Monday April 27, 2020, at 12:01AM.

Except as explicitly amended as below, all provisions of the April 23, 2020 Safer-At-Home Lake County Public Health Order remain in effect as originally set forth. This current Amendment will become effective at 12:01AM on Wednesday May 27, 2020 unless otherwise specifically provided for herein and will remain in effect until further notice.

3. Amendments

Lake County Public Health Order “COVID-19 Safer-At-Home Order (version April-23-2020)” is amended as follows:

- Replace paragraph “**7. Limitations on the Sale of Food and Beverages, Including Liquor, Beer and Wine.**” with the following:

Licensed Retail Food Establishments (including restaurants, cafes, and food trucks) in Lake County may offer food and beverage using delivery service, window service, walk-up service, drive-through service, drive-up service, curbside delivery, outside dining, limited indoor dining, or any other manner as approved by Lake County Public Health Agency through the Safe Food Establishment review and approval process, and in accordance with mandatory Social Distancing Requirements and COVID-19 precautions. Retail Food Establishments may, upon individual authorization by

LCPHA, operate these on-site, in-person restaurant services within approved limited “Business Social Distancing Protocol(s)” parameters beginning Wednesday, May 27, 2020.

Bars, Taverns, Brew-Pubs, and private clubs in Lake County must remain closed to in-person service and on-site consumption until further notice, in accordance with current Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment guidance.

- b. Replace paragraph “**10. Limitations on Short-Term Lodging**” section “b.” with the following:

All short-term lodging operations are prohibited from operating through May 31, 2020. Lodging Establishments may allow for return of guests beginning June 1, 2020, upon individual authorization to do so by Lake County Public Health Agency. Lodging Establishments must complete the Lake County Public Health Agency Safe Lodging Establishment review and approval process, and confirm compliance with mandatory COVID-19 precautions. Upon review and approval by LCPHA, Lodging Establishments will be issued a Safe Lodging Letter and allowed to welcome guests back beginning June 1, 2020. (Exception: If a short-term lodging unit is occupied by a local worker or contractor working locally, that worker or contractor may remain in the unit prior to June 1.)

- c. Remove paragraphs “**10. Limitations on Short-Term Lodging**” section “c,” “d,” and “e.”
